China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) Secretariate, Ministry of Planning, Development & Special Initiatives (MoPDSI) in Collaboration with Embassy of the People Republic of China are organizing an International Conference on, "Decade of China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) & Belt & Road Initiative (BRI): From Vision to Reality" on 24th - 25th July 2023 in Islamabad, Pakistan.

China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) being a strategic principal component of Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) focuses on infrastructure development and Socio-economic cooperation between China and Pakistan. This year marks the successful decade of BRI & CPEC. It is an appropriate moment to reflect on the achievements, challenges, and prospects of this game changer concept. Over the decade, the two countries have developed strong bonds in diverse fields and call themselves "Iron Brothers'. CPEC effectively helped Pakistan in improving its energy security as well as transport networks from north to south and laid foundation for a resilient infrastructure including ports, airports, roads, and railway. In the subsequent phase both countries have strong resolve to advance cooperation in the areas of agriculture, industry, science and technology, information technology, Socio-economic development, and people to people connectivity.

The conference aims to bring together policymakers, scholars, practitioners, and other stakeholders to exchange ideas and insights related to economic, social, environmental, and geopolitical impacts of CPEC and BRI. Furthermore, the conference will explore opportunities for enhanced cooperation, sustainable development, and inclusive growth in the subsequent phase of CPEC.

Research papers, covering the various aspects of CPEC and BRI, are invited on the following themes:
